atricia and Simon Gorringe spent two years hunting for the perfect house. We wanted a period property with at least three bedrooms that we could add to, says Patricia. 'And we had to be able to live in it straight away because of our busy jobs in banking." The Georgian house they found was ideal, although the decor was not to their taste. But we loved the high ceilings and sash windows," says Patricia. 'It had so much potential.'

Starting on the lower-ground floor, the couple set about lightening and opening up the gloomy kitchen and dining room by widening the doorway through to the kitchen and using glass within the framework. Patricia then found a cabinetmaker to reproduce

kitchen units she had seen in a magazine. When we finished, we realised we had to do the whole house, says Patricia. We were thrilled with the difference the changes made.

The house was replastered and rewired, skirting and cornicing was replaced using original designs, and the walls were painted with colours from Farrow & Ball's National Trust range in keeping with the house's Georgian origins. While the work was going on, the couple lived in a first-floor flat they had bought in the neighbouring house. 'We would have gone mad otherwise, as the builders were there for a year,' says Patricia.

Eight months after the builders had finished the work and with their daughter Cerys, now 18 months, about to be born, the couple decided to add a garden room. It was important to have more space next to the kitchen for children, explains Patricia. The area had been a seating area in the garden that we never used, so we didn't have to sacrifice any space.' The couple also knocked through to the flat next door to create more rooms.

Patricia and Simon don't regret taking on such a hig project, and would do it again. 'The pleasure achieved from creating your perfect environment is addictive,' says Patricia.
